

Sacramento City College **Voter Guide – Student Elections – 2011**

Constitution

In 2009, the Los Rios Community College District (LRCCD) Board of Trustees asked for a review of the current student association constitutions and changes leading to increased involvement and consistency across the district's four colleges. A district committee of students, staff, faculty, and managers was convened and a thorough review, including proposed changes to policies and regulations, concluded in 2010.

The proposed changes to the LRCCD Policies and Regulations (<http://www.losrios.edu/legal/GCpolreg.htm>) as they pertain to Student Associations (P-2311 and R-2311) were approved by the Board of Trustees. In response to these changes, the current student government was required to rewrite their constitution to be in compliance. As such, the Associated Student Government as we now know it will be reformed to be named the Student Associated Council made up of three components:

- Student Senate, whose mission will be to represent and advocate for the common interests of SCC students;
- Club and Events Board, whose mission will be to promote student involvement and activities through clubs and events;
- Joint Budget Committee, whose sole purpose will be to provide a mechanism for the appropriate allocation of Student Associated Council funds and resources.

If you vote "yes," you vote to ratify the new constitution, thus reforming the current student government into the Student Associated Council and its three components. Upon ratification, the implementation date will be November 1, 2011 or after new members are elected, whichever comes later.

If you vote "no," you do not want to ratify the new constitution and look for further action from your current student government. If ratification fails, the current student government will look for input and work to make the appropriate changes to the constitution and it will be voted on again in fall, 2011.
